Highlight from last Sunday by Rev'd Thom Jee

Last week's **sermon** delivered by Thom focuses on the spiritual principles of **Christian giving** and stewardship.

Using the biblical story of the **widow's mite**, Thom emphasizes that God values the **sincere heart** of the giver rather than the specific monetary amount contributed.

He encourages us to view our finances as a **symbolic reflection** of our love for Jesus, asserting that true generosity should be **sacrificial and joyful** rather than dutiful.

Thom concludes his sermon with an invitation

for us to make **financial pledges** to support our ministry while explicitly exempting guests from any obligation to donate.

Ultimately, his sermon teaches us that since we believers cannot **outgive God**, we should manage our resources as temporary stewards of His **abundant grace**.

The World Cup and Domestic Abuse

Following England's World Cup semi-final defeat last Wednesday, West Midlands Police reported that emergency calls more than doubled, with 1083 calls received between 10pm and 3am. The force has not published how many of these were related to domestic abuse.

Clearly, football does not cause domestic abuse. However, well documented evidence shows that tournaments like the World cup can act as a trigger or intensifier where coercive or violent behaviour already exists.

So, please continue to be particularly vigilant and open to conversations if someone reaches out to you about this. You can then help that person to reach out to the safeguarding team for support. See below.
